Brutal Reality


- My pt numbers increasing, long waiting lists

- Not primary or secondary care




Serve All!

This section contains information to help support you or your family when dealing with diabetes. It covers diabetes and pregnancy and resources for children and parents of children who have diabetes.









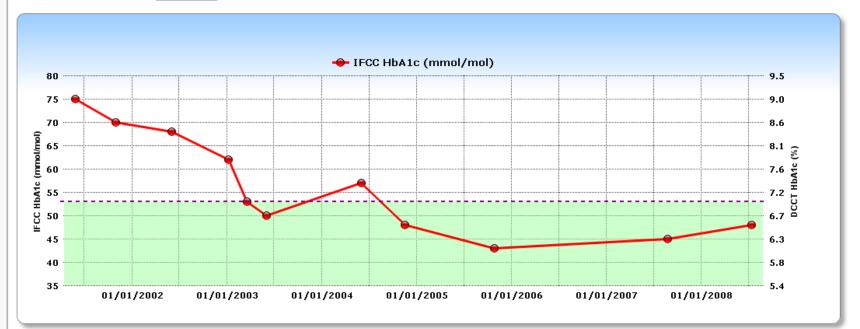



Self reported Patient Outcomes

(>1000 participants)

89.6% felt it helped them make better use of their consultation

88.2% felt it helped them manage their diabetes better

90.3% felt it improved their knowledge

89.3% felt it improved their motivation

Clinical Outcomes

Pre and post MDMW use comparison show modest improvements in HbA1C, BP, cholesterol, weight (p<0.01)
