

Prevention of Amputation

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- 1-4% of people with diabetes will develop an ulcer per year
- Approximately 58% of DFU patients will become clinically infected.
- The number of diabetes-related amputations in England has now reached an all-time high of 20 a day



- Individuals with diabetic foot ulcers have a 50% chance of mortality in 5 years
- Early diagnosis and early intervention by an MDT approach can achieve good outcomes

Learning Points

Any red, hot, swollen feet – consider Charcot until ruled out

Refer early to MDT

Early diagnosis helps prevents deformity

A diagnosis of Charcot is a life changing event for the patient


Learning Points

- Early referral to podiatry and the MDT
- It takes a team to heal an ulcer
- Patients with a history of foot ulcer have a 50% risk of re-ulceration





- Podiatry has a tiered approach to match podiatry need to risk classification
- MDT capacity is currently limited
 - West Hertfordshire 16 appointments per week
 - East Hertfordshire 28 appointments per week
- Multidisciplinary team working is essential for
- When people with a foot attack get rapid access for treatment by a specialist multi-disciplinary team this has been shown to promote faster healing and fewer amputations, saving money and lives.
